Dear Parents and Guardians,

Hello from a very snowy Park Street this morning!

It is wonderful this time of year to hear the children practising for the Nativity, although I really miss the singing! Hopefully next Christmas this will all return! Fortunately, Mrs Shankland has managed to continue rehearsing the Key Stage 2 choir, socially distanced and outside. We have also managed to arrange an impromptu performance, which will take place outside the Round Church on 15th December. I have had to guarantee that this will follow Covid protocols, so please, if you come to watch try to social distance from people outside your household, and even though it will be outside, it would be helpful if you could wear masks. This will show that we are taking care, under the current restrictions. The children will be standing as far apart as possible during the singing. On Thursday 17th December, the signing club will also take place outside the Round Church, where they will perform the Christmas songs that they have learned.

As outlined on the next page, the Nativity will be videoed and uploaded to Microsoft Teams, where you can log in to watch it at your convenience. Owl class logins will be sent out next week. All the other children have already been given their logins—please check these work over the next week, so that we can sort out any problems before the end of term.

### Guitar tuition

Hello

My name is Richard Holmes and I will be coming to Park Street to teach guitar and ukulele, starting in the New Year. As well as Park Street, I also teach guitar at Bottisham Village College, St Faith's and Fairstead House School. I have been playing the guitar for 30 + years and almost been teaching as long as that (yes, I am that old!). I am very happy to teach from year 1 onwards, using the ASBRSM exam board for classical guitar and books, the London College of Music for ukulele and acoustic guitar and books. I use the Trinity Rock and Pop syllabus for more rock and pop based students. I also regularly take song requests, and teach Ed Sheeran/Taylor Swift/Slipknot/The Beatles etc to further their song and technique repertoire. Students will need their own instruments for lessons to allow them sufficient practice time at home. These are relatively inexpensive for beginners to buy and I am happy to give advice about purchases. Prices for lessons are £13, for a 20 minute individual lesson. Payment is required one term in advance, before lessons are due to start.

We have been learning about all types of slavery. From Greeks and Romans to modern day we have studied and done some presenting to the class.

When we learnt that slavery still exists today and that there are actually more slaves now than in the time of the transatlantic slave trade, we wanted to make a difference. You have probably noticed the class is wearing their clothes inside out for the month of December. We are doing this to grab attention and spark conversation.
