We have been learning about all types of slavery. From Greeks and Romans to modern day we have studied and done some presenting to the class.

When we learnt that slavery still exists today and that there are actually more slaves now than in the time of the transatlantic slave trade, we wanted to make a difference. You have probably noticed the class is wearing their clothes inside out for the month of December. We are doing this to grab attention and spark conversation.

Remote Learning

Following the government's announcement that schools have a statutory duty to provide access to remote learning, we have developed our Remote Learning Policy. As mentioned before, this will be delivered using Microsoft Teams (Tapestry for Class 1), making sure that lessons and activities are aligned with learning that would have taken place in school.
