Dear Parents and Guardians,

It has been wonderful to welcome everybody back to school ; it almost seems now that they have never been away! Everybody has quickly got back into routine, and the children are being kept very busy. They are proud to show all that they have learned whilst they have been learning at home, and the teachers are so thankful to you for having supported them so well over this period. Next week, they will be completing assessments so that we can find out where their gaps in learning are, and plan to address these as quickly as possible.

Thank you also for continuing to follow all of our Covid-19 safety protocols. It is really important that we continue to stay safe in what is hopefully the last stage of the pandemic. Please note the section about testing children with symptoms over the next week—if there are any cases at the end of next week, we will need to notify families to self-isolate over the holidays. Although there has been a slight rise, this was expected as there has been a huge amount of asymptomatic testing taking place. The fact that the increase is so small is reassuring.

Please read the attached letter regarding our RSE curriculum. This is a response to the questionnaire sent out before Christmas, and also part of our consultation with you about this. I hope that the information is reassuring to you—the PSHE service materials that we will be using are very carefully devised and will be thoughtfully presented by the teachers. These are available for you to see on your child's Microsoft Team—please look in the files on the RSE channel.

The Local Authority will be supporting families who are eligible for free school meals over the Easter holidays. There are also support grants available to help vulnerable families with other difficulties. Please see the attached letter giving you details about this.

#### **Covid –19 positive test results**

**IF your child is in school, and needs to take a Covid-19 test next week, please could you make sure that you book to go to a testing station, rather than using a postal test. Should the test be positive, we would have to inform close contacts, and this might mean self – isolation starting on the first weekend of the Easter holiday. It is useful to know as soon as possible, if this needs to take place.**

#### **Flamingo Class Teacher**

Sadly Mrs Williman will be leaving us at the end of term. I am sure you will join me in thanking her for covering the class at a difficult time, leading online learning and the past few weeks in school. After Easter, Mrs Stevenson will be the class teacher, until Miss Roberts starts after half-term. She will be supported by Ms Orrock and Mrs Anantha, with Ms Orrock continuing to teach the class on Fridays. Mrs Cardenas will have responsibility for Eagle Class for this period.

#### **Road Closure**

Thank you very much to the group of parents who have been working with the council to organize the road closure of Park Street at pick-up and drop-off times. This will be coming into effect from 12th April. The road will be closed to cars and cycles whilst the children are crossing the road. If you are able to help with this, please contact Mrs Daria Gordon (Isabella's mum in Owl Class) who is co-ordinating the scheme. I am so relieved that we have been able to put this in place to keep the children safer as they enter and leave school.

### School Meals

Nourish have recently opted to terminate their contract with us, so we have had to look for a new supplier for our school meals. Fortunately we have not been alone in this—we have been researching other providers with St Phillips Primary School, and All Saints Inter-church Academy. From 12th April, the meals will be provided by Aspens, who are a local company providing meals to several other primary schools in Cambridge. More information about this and menus will be available next week. Unfortunately there will be an increase in the price for the paid-for meals—because we are a small school, all the companies were unable to meet our current price.

### Covid-19 Testing

All staff working in school are now able to test themselves for Covid-19 twice-weekly at home, using lateral flow devices. Should there be any asymptomatic positive cases revealed by this testing, this may mean closure of 'bubbles'. The testing will take place on Sunday and Wednesday evenings—parents will be notified as soon as possible that evening if their children need to stay at home and/or self-isolate. **This testing is also available to households of primary pupils.
